#### **President's Message**

Greetings Fellow Rockhounds,

We have a lot of things to go over so get our pen, paper, and calendars out. First up, our club is holding our February club meeting at the Wetumpka Civic Center, 410 South Main Street, on Thursday, February 23rd. The Wetumpka Impact Crater Commission is holding a lecture from Dr. David King on his work identifying the impact crater that shaped the topography of Wetumpka.

On Saturday, February 25th our club will be touring the Impact Crater as part of the Crater Commission's program. Our club has secured approximately 30 spots on the Commission's 9:55 tour slot. The cost is \$25 for adults, \$15 for children under 18 years old. The tour is not recommended for children under 10 years old; the tour vans are not equipped for child seats and booster seats for the trip around Wetumpka. After the tour we have a group reservation at Rancho Grande restaurant in Wetumpka. Please RSVP to Chris Rutherford, as soon as possible. We only have a few spots left available. On March 21, 2023 our club will return to the Crump Community Center for our regularly scheduled meeting on the third Tuesday of the month. We will have retired Auburn University geology professor Dr, Jim Saunders return for a presentation on the Geology of Diamonds, specifically the kimberlites and carbonatites of the Diamond Crater State Park in Arkansas. For those of you who might recall, Dr. Saunders spoke to our club several years ago about the gold fields of Idaho and the historic gold fields of central Alabama around Horseshoe Bend area.

Also, in March we are scheduling our annual shop clean-up day at the club workshop for Saturday March 18, 2023.

We need as many hands as possible, and especially all the club members who routinely work at the shop, to come out at 9:00 am to help clean, organize, and repair equipment at the club's workshop. This is a weather driven event and is subject to change if it's raining or very wet.

On April 1, 2023 our club will be hosting a collecting field trip to the Hogg Mine in LaGrange, Georgia. This mine is about 2 hours east of Montgomery at exit 13, interstate 1-85. Turn south at the exit onto Highway 209 and proceed south 3.5 miles to the mine entrance on your right. The cost is \$35 for adults, kids 17 and under are free with a paying adult. Please arrive by 9:00 am and check in with a Hogg Mine worker for a brief safety briefing. We will be able to collect all the rose quartz, some beryl and some tournaline that you want. The club will provide a hand cart to help carry out any large yard rocks you want or just help carry out a heavy 5-gallon bucket. The club will have bottled water and some snacks for club members on this field trip.


Chris mentioned that a shop service was being planned for February with more info coming. A group trip to the Sylacauga Marble Festival was suggested.
