SYLACAUGA MARBLE FESTIVAL

Members of the club met at the BB Comer Library for a tour of the marble statues and to hear the history of the Marble Festival. The Library Docent, Mandi, informed those in attendance that Sylacauga marble is the whitest marble in the world, except for some places in Italy. It is so white that light can shine through, making it one of the most desirable marbles in the world. A fun fact is that this marble is also contained in Tums, Rolaids and chewing gum!

Outside, Randy Clark told members that the marble festival included 35 sculptors this year, including one from Italy who spoke very little English. It was so interesting to see the square blocks of marble take shapes and forms. Most of the sculptors take their work back home, but some leave them for the library. Most of the library sculptures were bought and then donated to the library. This is an annual event, and members were able to take souvenir pieces of marble that fell on the ground, as the sculptors created their masterpieces.

After watching the sculptors, members drove to Imerys Gantt's Quarry Observation Site where they mine the marble.
















































