Greetings Fellow Rockhounds,

Future Rockhounds Report... Apatite

Last month, Club President Chris Rutherford handed out Apatite specimens to all the Future Rockhounds. The Apatite specimens were bright blue in color, which is the preferred lapidary variant valued by collectors. But Apatite comes in a multitude of different colors ranging from colorless to yellow, green, brown, red, or blue. Apatite is a calcium phosphate mineral and the color variations are caused by minor components in the mineral, such as fluorine, chloride, hydroxides, and other elements. On the Moh's hardness scale it is classified as 5, the middle range of hardness. On a porcelain streak plate, apatite will always streak white regardless of the color of the stone. Economically, Apatite is a very important mineral found across the globe and is the primary source for phosphate-based fertilizers. The bones and teeth of humans are composed of a calcium-phosphate apatite mineral. When polished up, blue apatite is one of the most beautiful stones resembling our planet earth.
