




Greetings Fellow Rockhounds,

Our club will have its next scheduled club meeting on Tuesday, January 16th, 2024 at Perry Hill Road Methodist Church, while the Crump Center undergoes renovations this year. We will have a recap of the previous year's activities, a slide show of the Gem Show, special announcements for the upcoming year, as well as special projects and activities for the club. Please mark it on your schedule and plan on attending. During the Gem Show, I was informed that the Crump Center is scheduled for remodeling in 2024 and it will be closed to the public for approximately 9 months. Our club has secured the use of a local church to hold our meetings until the Crump Center can be re-opened.

Field Trips and Activities for 2024:

In March or April 2024 our club will hold our annual new members field trip to the Hogg Mine in Lagrange GA. Just a quick 2-hour trip north on 185 is the Hogg Mine where we can collect all manner of Rose Quartz, Tourmaline, and Beryl. We will have our hand truck with us so if you want to grab that big 250 lbs rose quartz boulder, we can help as a club to get it loaded into your vehicle.

In February or March, we will hold our annual workshop clean-up day. We will meet one Saturday morning and clean up, re-arrange after the gem show, and fellowship together while we organize the workshop.

Also, in the Spring, I would like to organize a club camping trip to Noccalula Falls and Cathedral Caverns in NE Alabama. There is a very nice campground and cabins adjacent to the Noccalula Falls, hiking trails around and under the Falls, and then the Cathedral Caverns State Park is just a short 25 minute drive away for a club tour of the huge cave there.

This January or February, I would like to organize a museum field trip to Tuscaloosa, Alabama to visit the Alabama Museum of Natural History on the campus of Alabama. We can see the Hodges meteorite that crashed through a home in Sylacauga and struck a lady asleep on the couch. Also on display is the State fossil, the bassilasaurus hanging from the ceiling. There is also a nice football museum close by, and we can finish the trip visiting the Moundville State Park exploring the ancient Native American pyramid mounds.

The meeting was called to order by president Chris Rutherford, the October minutes were approved as published in the newsletter.


Iris delivered the treasurers' report.

Special President Message

During the 53rd annual Gem Show at Garret Coliseum there was a new display at the Information booth. Club President, Chris Rutherford, has commissioned a talented woodworker to create a display board of the State of Alabama with the 67 individual counties highlighted. Within each county, there is a cutout for the mounting of a cabochon and then room to fill the county with crushed stone or beading.

The inspiration for this display board is based on the Southeast Federation of Mineralogical Societies' Cabochon Eagle Display.

I would like for our club to work together on this joint project to mount cabochons on the board and then fill in the counties with some type of small stone. My intention is to select stones representative of each county, or stones from the specific counties to make cabochons. For example, use white marble from Sylacauga for Talladega County. Use Red iron ore stone for Jefferson County, etc. If we can't find suitable stones for the counties, then any beautiful cabochon any club member wants to donate will be accepted.



Be looking for more information on the display board throughout the year and be looking through your collection for any nice cabochon you would like to donate. We will create a permanent record on the display identifying the stones as well as the club members who worked and donated the pieces.

AFMS Code of Ethics

I will respect both private and public property and will do no collecting on privately owned land without the owner's permission.

I will keep informed on all laws, regulations of rules governing collecting on public lands and will observe them.

I will to the best of my ability, ascertain the boundary lines of property on which I plan to collect.

I will use no firearms or blasting material in collecting areas.

I will cause no willful damage to property of any kind - fences, signs, buildings.

I will leave all gates as found.

I will build fires in designated or safe places only and will be certain they are completely extinguished before leaving the area.

I will discard no burning material - matches, cigarettes, etc.

I will fill all excavation holes which may be dangerous to livestock.

I will not contaminate wells, creeks or other water supply.

I will cause no willful damage to collecting material and will take home only what I can reasonably use.

I will practice conservation and undertake to utilize fully and well the materials I have collected and will recycle my surplus for the pleasure and benefit of others.

I will support the rockhound project H.E.L.P. (Help Eliminate Litter Please) and will leave all collecting areas devoid of litter, regardless of how found.

I will cooperate with field trip leaders and those in designated authority in all collecting areas.

I will report to my club or Federation officers, Bureau of Land management or other authorities, any deposit of petrified wood or other materials on public lands which should be protected for the enjoyment of future generations for public educational and scientific purposes.

I will appreciate and protect our heritage of natural resources.

I will observe the "Golden Rule", will use "Good Outdoor Manners" and will at all times conduct myself in a manner which will add to the stature and Public "Image" of Rockhounds everywhere
